Jordan Response Plan for Syria Crisis -2023 Update

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Jordan Response Plan (JRP) remains as the only government led refugee response plan in partnership with international community in order to respond and meet the needs of Syria crisis, while mitigating the impact endured as result of Syria crisis.

Twelve years into Syria crisis, Jordan remains at the core of one of the worst humanitarian crisis in our times. Despite the economic challenges, and consequences of COVID-19 pandemic , coupled with limited resources; Jordan continues to host one of the highest number of refugees per capita globally, including 1.36 million Syrian. Meanwhile, the needs continue to grow and add tremendous strain on the Kingdom's public services and infrastructure that are exhausting our abortive capacities and heightening vulnerabilities, which threaten losing our development gains.

The Government of Jordan records' show that there are 1.3 million Syrian living in Jordan, nearly 90% are living among hosts community, while the remaining 10% opted to live in one of refugee camps and nearly half of Syrian refugees in Jordan are registered with UNHCR Jordan.

JORDAN RESPONSE PLAN 2023

JRP 2020-2022 was extended to include JRP 2023, where JRP 2023 has the same requirements of JRP 2022, the plan continues with the same participatory approach and principles as the previous JRP

The total requirements of JRP 2023 is \$2,276,523,453. This is desegregated as below:
